Dear Parents and Carers

I wish you and your children a warm welcome back after the Half Term break, and hope you were able to enjoy it together. We are straight back into the swing of things at school and have introduced a new approach to questioning the children in lessons. Teachers assess children's progress throughout lessons so they can gauge how much the children understand. This is called formative assessment, or Assessment for Learning (AfL), and one of the best and most common ways of doing it is by asking children questions. Research shows that when children are asked to put their hands up to answer questions, there is always a number of children who choose not to, so they do not get the chance to answer. This means the teacher does not get a true picture of how well every child in the class understands the lesson, and this can mean that some children do not make the progress they should. At Brunswick, we now have a 'No Hands Up' approach to asking questions in lessons. A variety of different ways of answering will be used instead, including asking children directly. If a child does not know the answer, the teacher will ask the child additional follow up questions to gauge his/her understanding, and not knowing the answer is absolutely fine; it gives the teacher a true picture of what the child needs next to make good progress. Dylan Williams, the academic who has carried out a lot of this research, says this in his book 'The Right Questions, The Right Way':

'The fundamental flaw in the traditional questioning model [hands up] is that it makes participation voluntary. The confident students engage by raising their hands - and by engaging in classroom discussion, they become smarter. But others decline the invitation to participate and thus miss out on the chance to get smarter.'

Everyone at Brunswick must have an equal chance to 'get smarter', so no hands up for questioning in lessons. Our Focus Values of Respect, Tolerance and Courtesy teach children to respect others' answers and wait for others whilst they think of their answer before responding to the teacher.

Parents' Evenings are scheduled for 6 and 7 November for all classes apart from 2A, 3A and 5B, where parents and carers have been contacted separately. Please make every effort to attend, as children make the best progress when their parents, carers and teachers work together to support each other. We look forward to welcoming you.
