Dear Parents and Carers

Thank you for your patience regarding this fortnight's Newsletter, which has been delayed unavoidably by 2 days. Since I last wrote to you our Year 6 pupils have taken their SATs, which they did calmly and professionally, fuelled by breakfast bagels and juice every morning of the test week at 08:30. Thanks go to all the staff who helped the children to feel comfortable and confident, and to the children themselves, every one of whom tried their best. Children in Year 2 have also taken assessment tests to inform their teachers' judgement of their progress and attainment at the end of Key Stage 1. Bananas and brioches fuelled these children's concentration, and thanks go to all the staff who made sure the process was low-key and stress free. Thanks also go to all parents and carers who make sure their children are in school on time every day consistently, who read with them regularly and support them with their homework. Your efforts and support are so very much appreciated.

The school also received its Section 8 Monitoring Visit from HMI (Her Majesty's Inspectorate) on Wednesday 16 May. The day went smoothly and positively, and we await the written outcome - a letter - in the next few weeks.

And the hens Fi Fi and Coo Coo have started laying! Not enough eggs so far to open a shop, but enough to use in cooking with Jonny in The House Kitchen.

The big news this week is the introduction of the GDPR (General Data Protection Regulation). From 25 May new regulations come into force in the UK regarding the use of personal data (information). For parents and carers of pupils in primary schools, you will see little change, but there are some measures that all schools must take, and that we have taken at Brunswick Park. These are:

Updated Privacy Notices on the school's website;

The identification of a named Data Protection Officer (DPO);

A review of consent to the use of pupil images, sent to parents and carers on 22 May 2018;

A review of the school's Data Protection Policy, available from 25 May 2018 from the School Office and on the website.

Please familiarise yourselves with these; the consent review has been sent home with your child today and it also on this Newsletter.

With best wishes for a peaceful and enjoyable rest of week and Half Term Break. See you on Monday 4 June, when our Focus Value will be Liberty.

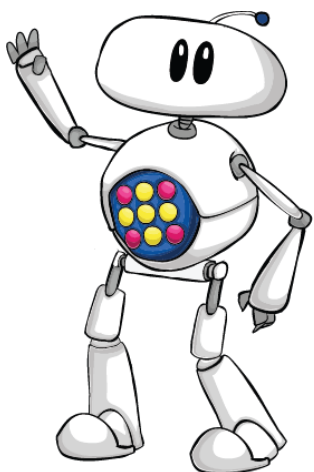

Dear Parents and Carers

As you may be aware, the General Data Protection Regulation comes into force from 25 May 2018. This has placed additional obligations on organisations which will affect how they handle data.

We take cyber security and data protection very seriously and we have put steps in place within our organisation to ensure we maintain secure and compliant systems. As part of this obligation we have reviewed our consents to photographic images.

As a school, we regularly use photographs to show how our pupils and the school as a whole develop. Images can also help us illustrate and communicate with parents about upcoming events and can help advertise and market the school to prospective parents and pupils.

We are also aware that parents and pupils really enjoy being able to see their images and would like to give all pupils this opportunity.

There are a number of instances when the school may take photos of your child, specifically: -

- We publish photos and videos on the school's website to promote the school to current and prospective parents as well as providing updates on current events;
- Within our newsletters we may provide photos of recent events or achievements from our pupils;
- In order to promote the school, we send out prospectuses, flyers, leaflets and brochures which contain images to show life at our school. These are sent to prospective parents;
- We may also use other promotional materials such as banners and signs which may contain photographic images for prospective parents to view;
- We may be visited by the media who will take photographs or film footage of events. Pupils will sometimes appear in these images, which may then be published in local or national newspapers, in televised news programmes and on social media sites;
- We publish photos in and around the school building to illustrate to current pupils and parents life around the school, including educational materials and images of recent trips and events. These can be seen from time to time by other parents or visitors within the school;
- In promotional materials to show the history and character of the school to future generations.

We follow guidance as set by data protection legislation (mainly the General Data Protection Regulation) as well as guidance set by the Information Commissioner's Office on taking photos in schools and obtaining consent.

The data protection laws give children rights over their own data where they are considered to have the required capacity to understand them. Most children will reach this level of understanding from the age of 12 and so it may be necessary for the school to obtain this consent from the child directly. If this is not suitable, the school will consider the preferences set out below.

It is our policy not to name pupils in photographs/images unless specific consent is gained in the first instance.

Consent to using your child's images will last throughout your child's time at the school and will continue to apply for a short time after your child leaves (except for images published for historical purposes which may be kept for an extended period of time to show the history of the school).

School Office Staff requested your consent to the use of your child's images on 5 February 2018. If you responded to that request and you do not want to change it, **YOU DO NOT NEED TO DO ANYTHING**. If you did not respond in February 2018 and/or wish to change your consent, **you need to complete this sheet and return it to the School Office by FRIDAY 1 JUNE 2018**. We will respect your decisions when publishing photos moving forward.

You can withdraw your consent at any time and can do so by writing to Brunswick Park Primary School at office@brunswickpark.southwark.sch.uk asking to stop using your child's images. At that point they will not be used in future publications but we cannot prevent them from continuing to appear in publications already in circulation.

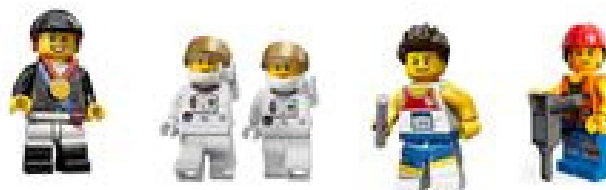


