Dear Parents and Carers

Welcome to our latest Newsletter; a very different proposition now Brunswick Park, like all other schools, is closed indefinitely. Except I am delighted to tell you that whilst it remains closed to all except children of Key Workers who have no other childcare arrangements and to some of our most vulnerable pupils who cannot always be cared for at home safely, we have been receiving regular emailed reports and pictures from families who have been keeping incredibly busy doing all sorts of creative home learning activities.

Parents and carers across the land have suddenly been handed the responsibility for providing opportunities for their children to learn at home, and understandably this has caused anxiety: 'What if I'm doing too much? Too little? What if my children refuse? What if I can't get them off their X-Boxes to do any maths/writing/spelling/anything? What if I can't explain their work to them? What do I do if it becomes a battle?'

Please remember that all children are different, and that all you can do is your best. On weekdays stick to a simple routine that you change or stop at weekends so children know the difference. There are timetables on our website and on this Newsletter that you can adapt and follow.

In term time teachers will continue to set and send work on Mondays, check in with you on Wednesdays and conclude the week on Fridays, and they are always there for you to ask questions via the

office@brunswickpark.southwark.sch.uk email address. Our website is packed with home learning links, tasks and ideas, which we continue to add to, and the children have their TTRockstars, MyMaths and Bug Club logins. Keep sending in your photos - lots of which are on this Newsletter - and let us know how you are getting on. I have heard reports of drawing anatomically correct dinosaurs, staging puppet shows with home made sock puppets, making rainbows to thank NHS staff, writing stories, poems and biographies and doing lots of PE with Joe Wicks. The TTRockstars Battle organised by Mrs Fallon is going great guns - these scores were correct as of this morning:

In other news, Brunswick Park Primary School, with the support of its Governing Body, has been made a Designated Childcare Hub for the next 2 weeks, providing childcare not only for our Key Workers who have no other childcare arrangements but for those from other schools which have

had to close completely. Even though everyone's movements are restricted, the next 2 weeks is the Easter Holiday, or Spring Break, during which you and your children should have some well-earned downtime. Our teachers will be on holiday from 6 April to 17 April, spending time with their own children in their households and trying to make sense of all that is happening. During these two weeks, your children will continue to be sent activities to do, but the emphasis will be more on fun. Please look out for the first lot on Monday! Normal home learning service will resume on Monday 20 April when the teachers return, and you can still make contact with the school in the usual ways throughout the holiday.


My Diary




The Man Who Went Shopping
