Dear Parents and Carers

Thank you to those who have already filled it in; your feedback is really valuable in helping us to improve your experience of school, and when it can be harder to see us because of COVID-19 restrictions, communication becomes even more important.

Please remember that the school cannot afford to send multiple SMS texts and paper copies of letters. Email is free, as are forms of social media such as Twitter, and are the quickest and most efficient way of sending information. However, they are only effective if checked regularly, which is your responsibility. If you have forgotten your ParentMail password or are having difficulty accessing messages, please contact the School Office Staff who will be happy to help.

Children return to school after the holiday on Tuesday 5 January 2021. The children having a hot lunch from 5-8 January when they return are Reception, Year 1, Year 3 and Year 5, and the menu is on the school website. All that remains is for me to wish you and your families a peaceful, happy, safe and healthy holiday, and to wish you all the very best for the New Year. Telling the School about a child's Positive COVID-19 Test Results over the Festive Holiday

If your child receives a positive test result for COVID-19 between Saturday 19 December up to and including Thursday 24 December, please send an email with your child's name, class and date the positive test result was received to

brunswick@bpschool.org

between 9.00am and 12 Noon.

Please do not use the usual school email address as it will not be monitored, and you do not need to report positive test results to the school after 24 December until next term begins.

What do I do if my child is ill?

Government Guidance states:

'If anyone in school becomes unwell with a new, continuous cough or a high temperature, or has a loss of, or change in, their normal sense of taste or smell (anosmia), they must be sent home and be advised to follow the guidance for households with possible or confirmed coronavirus (COVID-19) infection.

This sets out that they must:

- self-isolate for at least 10 days*
- arrange to have a test to see if they have coronavirus (COVID-19)*

If your child becomes unwell at home with any of these symptoms, you must inform the School Office then follow the guidance:

self-isolate and get a test.

If the test results are negative and your child is well, s/he should return to school.

If they are positive you must inform the School Office immediately so the Local Health Protection Team can take appropriate action.

The Melanin Health & Wellbeing Lunch Box Project is led by a team of local volunteers.

It aims to source and deliver free nutritious and healthy traditional African Caribbean and Asian meals and groceries to 500 vulnerable BAME single parent households within Southwark.

If you are a single parent household from the BAME community in the Walworth area of Southwark, and your family is entitled to Free School Meals or you have NRPF, this project is for you.

Face Coverings

Staff at the school gates wear face coverings at the beginning and end of the day as they come into contact with lots of adults.

- If you need help with the application form, please speak to Anna in the Nursery.
- If your child has an EHCP and you are interested in a place in the Resource Base, please speak to Susanna Renwick, our SENDCo.

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Year 2 pupils have been very creative, making lots of 3D models. Inspired by their Humanities topic, The Gunpowder Plot, they made a model of the Houses of Parliament. They also made 3D boats and shoe-box habitats for the characters from the book The Journey Home. And finally, did you spot the 3D model of the Polar Express?

At Brunswick we value learning at home as well as school, and this term there has been great engagement with and enthusiasm for our Maker Mat activities that link to Year Group topics.

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


Year 5 - Autumn 2

HOME LEARNING MAKER MAT

Use clay or playdough to make an ancient Greek vase.	With the help of an adult cook a traditional Greek meal.	Read the story of the Trojan War Horse. Then make a 3D model of the horse.
Draw the flag of the Olympic games or create a 3D model of it. You can use any media you like.	Our topic has been Ancient Greece.	Select your favourite Greek god and create a 3D model about them. Remember to evaluate it carefully!
Make a 3D model of an ancient Greek shield, spear or sword.	Make a 3D model of an ancient Greek temple.	Draw the map of ancient Greece and name the main cities.

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Year 5 pupils have been learning about the ancient Greeks and creating all sort of objects inspired by this ancient civilisation. Here you can see 3D models of the Trojan Horse and ancient Greek shields, and drawings inspired by the ancient and modern Olympic Games. Did you know that the Olympic Games started in ancient Greece?

HOME LEARNING MAKER MAT

Draw a plate and fill it with a typical British meal consumed during WWI.	Make a 3D model of a shelter used during World War II.	Design a piece of artwork as a tribute to someone who fought in the war.
Research information about the London Blitz and create a piece of artwork inspired by it.	Our Topic is World War II.	Use any media you like to draw or make a 3D model of a Spitfire plane.
Create a double page writing about Anne Frank.	Research items that evacuated children would need to take with them. Draw and label the items.	Design a D-Day medal. Can you make a model of it?

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Year 6 pupils have been learning about WWII and its catastrophic impact around the world. They have been making 3D models of suitcases that evacuated children could have taken with them. They also created various pieces of artwork inspired by WWII and its perception.



To try to make understanding its guidance easier, the Government has introduced HANDS FACE SPACE.

At school, primary-aged children do HANDS with extra washing and sanitiser, and FACE and SPACE by being kept in consistent groups and, if age-appropriate, facing forwards in class.

Parents, carers and visitors need to do all 3:

Regular handwashing/sanitising;

Wearing a face covering inside the school building;

Maintaining social distance inside the school building and on the school premises including Bantry and Picton Street.
