Dear Parents and Carers June's Focus Values are **PERSEVERANCE** and **COURAGE**

A warm welcome back after the Half Term Break, to what is, as you can see from the list of dates below, an action packed 7 weeks until the school year ends on 21 July. Some parents have asked me recently to clarify some aspects of school attendance expectations, which I share with you here:

Children are entitled to 190 days' education per academic year, and unless they are sick and too ill to attend, are expected to come to school every day. Attending school for 190 days = 100% attendance.

If your child is absent from school due to sickness and you provide sufficient evidence, the absence is authorised. This means that it is agreed that your child can be at home.

If your child is absent from school and no or insufficient reason is given, the absence is unauthorised. This means that it has not been agreed that your child can be at home. Unauthorised absence includes lateness when there is no or insufficient reason for it. Unauthorised absence also includes holiday; holidays must be taken outside term time in the 175 days available. Head Teachers cannot authorise holidays in term time. Both authorised and unauthorised absence affect a child's attendance percentage; if a child is not in school for any reason, the percentage will drop. If absence is authorised it does not mean attendance stays at 100%, because the child is still not in school.

Children's attendance is reported annually to parents, including the number of authorised and unauthorised sessions of absence. Good attendance is 95%+; Excellent attendance is 98%+. The whole school attendance target is 97%. You will find this on your child's school report, sent to you at the end of June.

In other news, our Nursery is filling up for September, which is really encouraging. Please see the information below about how to apply for a place. And if you are interested in becoming a school governor, you have until Friday to let me know. Have a wonderful – very hot, it would appear – weekend. Take good care. Wishing you a peaceful and enjoyable fortnight ahead.

Do you want to become a Parent Governor?

The Term of Office of one of our Parent Governors comes to an end in July, so soon there will be a vacancy on the Governing Body of Brunswick Park Primary School.

What does a school governor do?

Governors are responsible for overseeing the management side of a school: strategy, policy, budgeting and staffing. They enable their school to run as effectively as possible, working alongside senior leaders and supporting teachers to provide excellent education to children. Being a school governor is a commitment to attending governing body meetings which consider issues such as setting the school vision, mitigating financial risk and scrutinising educational outcomes. They are also involved in the school community, acting as critical friends to the head teacher and senior leaders.

Governors bring a wide range of skills and expertise from their professional lives to the governing board and schools benefit greatly from working with skilled volunteers, for example anyone with experience of finance, law, premises management or human resources. For example, a governor with business know-how can transform the running of a school.

Brunswick Park's Governing Body meets monthly in term time at 6pm. Meetings typically last 2 hours. In addition, governors visit the school during the day to see it in operation, and report back to the board. If you would like to put yourself forward to be a parent governor, you need to be a parent of a child/children who currently attend Brunswick Park Primary School.

Please give your name and your child's class to Aujorie Delpratt in the School Office by Friday 16 June 2023 at 4pm. If more than one name is received, there will be an election in which all the school's parents and carers can vote.

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What is Southwark PACT?

PACT – Parents and Communities Together

Overview

PACT is a community-led social support project, set up by Citizens UK, where parents of 0-3s meet weekly to participate in different collaborative activities. The project adopts a community organising approach to bring parents together with community organisations, health professionals, statutory services, schools and children's centres to reduce social isolation, support the wellbeing of parents and to support children's developmental outcomes.

Magic Beans (serves about 8)

These are called 'Magic Beans' because it seems like magic that such a delicious dish can be made so easily!

Ingredients:

- 1. 5 the of olive or vegetable oil
- 2. 2 top of cumin seeds
- 3. I medium sized onion
- 4. I stick of celery
- 5. I fat carrot
- 6. 4 cloves of garlic
- 7. I red chilli and I green chilli
- 8. I tsp of salt
- 9. I top of smoked paprika
- 10.1 400g tin of kidney beans
- 1. 1 400g tin of flageolet beans
- 12.1 400g tin of cannellini beans
- 13.1 4.00g tin of chopped tomatoes

Methodi

- I. Peel and finely chop the onion, carrot and garlic.
- 2. Finely chop the celery stick and both the chillies.
- 3. Heat the oil in a large, heavy bottomed pot
- 4. When it's hot, add the cumin seeds.
- 5. When they pop, add all the chopped vegetables.
- 6. Add the salt and smoked paprika
- 7. Stir and cook gently until everything is soft (about 10 minutes).
- 8. Add the tomatoes, beans and the water from the tins.
- 9. Cook very gently for about 15 minutes, stirring from time to time.

This nutritious dish is perfect with brown basmati rice.

To pay for uniform online using ParentMail, you need to log in to your account and pay for the item/s before you collect them from the School on Wednesdays.




