Key facts

- Brit Bat – The naming ceremony for a girl
- Brit Milah – The naming ceremony for a boy
- Bar Mitzvah and Bat Mitzvah are important celebrations for Jewish families they symbolize the young person's responsibility for themselves.
- Bar Mitzvah is a ceremony to show a Jewish boy has become an adult.
- Bat Mitzvah is a ceremony to show a Jewish girl has become an adult.
- The Bar or Bat Mitzvah ceremony is usually held on the first Shabbat after a boy's 13 and a girl's 12 birthday.
- Bar Mitzvah means 'Son of the commandments' and Bat Mitzvah means 'Daughter of the commandments.'
- The young person must give a speech starting with 'Today I am a man/woman. They also read parts of the Torah.
- The Jewish special book is called the Torah.
