Key facts

- Sculpture is the art of making objects or figures
- Clay is a common material used for sculpture
- Carving stone or wood, or by casting metal or plaster are other techniques that can be used to create sculptures
- Papier mache is a mixture of paper and glue, or paper, flour and water, that becomes hard when it is dry
- Some famous sculptors include Michelangelo, Donatello, Auguste Rodin and Henry Moore
- Three dimensional shapes have three dimensions – length, width and height

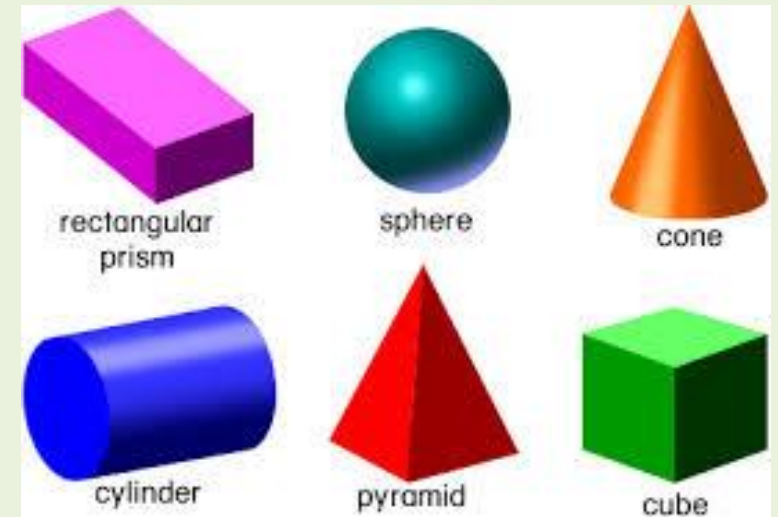
