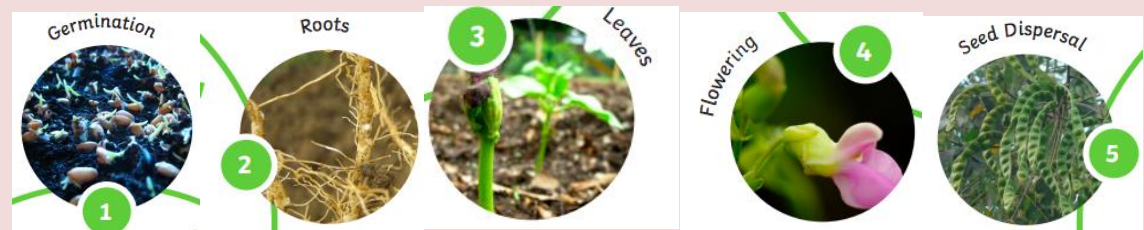


Year 2 Summer 1 Science- Plants

Key Facts

1. Seeds are usually sown whereas bulbs are planted by digging holes in the ground.
2. Another difference that can be seen is that seeds are usually inside a seed coat whereas the bulbs are itself the coat.
3. Bulbs are seasonal and regrow when the weather is right, whereas once seeds have matured and they die, new seeds must be replanted for a new mature plant to grow.
4. Seeds and bulbs go through different stages until they have reached the stage of a mature plant in the form of flowers or vegetables.
5. Things that a plant needs to grow are correct temperature, the correct amount of water, sunlight and space.
6. If a plant gets less amounts of what it needs to grow, this can affect how healthy a plant is, for example too much sunlight and not enough water may dry the plant out and cause it to wilt before it is able to mature.
