- Europe borders onto the Arctic Ocean, the Atlantic Ocean and the Mediterranean Sea.

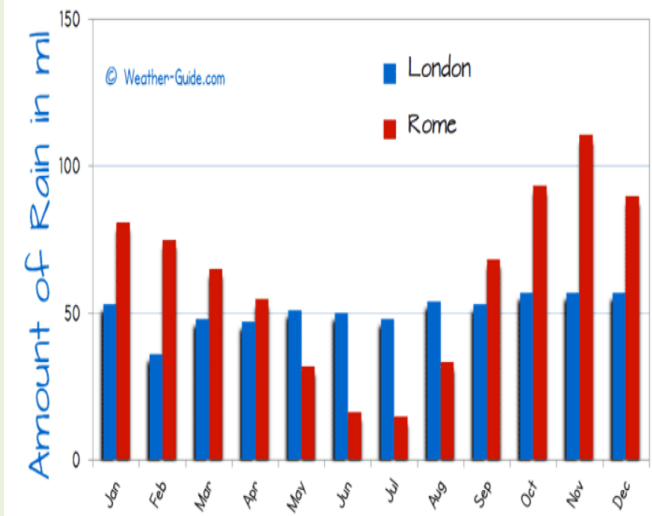
