## Key facts

- Christians believe that if they are committed to God, they will display love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control and not jealousy or self-importance. - Christians believe forgiveness is especially important. It is a main teaching of Jesus. In the Beatitudes, Jesus taught show mercy to receive mercy.
- Easter is a time to remember the significance of the death of Jesus Christ. Christians believe he died in order to forgive the sins of all the world.
- The parable of the Prodigal Son teaches about forgiveness. The Unforgiving Servant teaches about forgiveness.
